



PLANTATION PARADISE

Imagine paradise – an exclusive, private island retreat in the middle of the north Fijian sea, teeming with wildlife. With powder-sand beaches, rooms perched atop dramatic cliffs and an 18-hole golf course, Laucala is a dream come true. Previously a coconut plantation, the island is now home to more than 100 hectares of farmland, providing the hotel and its guests with fresh fruits, vegetables and herbs. Villas include private pools, outdoor showers and either deep stone or wooden baths, and the resort's centrepiece is a 25-metre-long lap pool.

ANDEAN ESCAPE

Once the capital of the Inca empire, the charming Peruvian city of Cusco is home to a host of historic buildings and sites. Formerly a colonial manor house, Inkaterra's La Casona is an intimate hotel with 11 suites set around a beautiful internal courtvard. Inside, rustic furnishings meet contemporary mod cons, including under-floor heating to keep the winter chill away. Inkaterra is a leading eco operator and one of the first of its kind in Peru, whose hotels combine luxury with oodles of charm.

A NIZAM FOR A NIGHT

An opulent mix of classic Italian and English Tudor architecture, and the former home of the nizams (local royalty) of Hyderabad, the Taj Falaknuma Palace has been lovingly restored by the Taj Group over a 10-year period, yet retains strong undercurrents of the past. Set in some 13 hectares of land, this classic palace hotel houses just 60 rooms, with original decor that includes tapestries, frescos and furniture, all exquisitely restored. The Palace Library contains almost 6,000 volumes, while the Mughal, Rajasthani and Japanese gardens – originally designed by a nizam – have been replanted and nurtured back to their former splendour.
