Every hour at the Inkaterra Reserva Amazonica leads to adventure. A group of brilliantly colored blue macaws passes overhead. A curious three-toed sloth peeks down from its canopy comfort zone, surveying the onlookers. Intrepid guides coax larger-than-life tarantulas from their dens. Chatty squirrel monkeys and massive red howlers indulge in the seasonal offerings of fallen fruit.



Expert guides will take guests into the rainforest to spot the region's diverse wildlife. The unpredictability of nature unveils different kinds of wildlife sightings and interactions each day. Guests have the freedom to choose their own adventures based on the vast outdoor enthusiast menu — some by canoe, some by boat, some on foot, others suspended high in the treetop canopy.
