



Following the tragic landslide (huayco) that occurred on Monday in Chosica near Lima, claiming eight lives and leaving many others injured and homeless, targeting climate change has never been more important.

On Saturday 28th March, Inkaterra took part in 'La Hora del Planeta' (Earth Hour) across all its lodges to both show support to those affected by the recent events in Peru and to make a contribution to helping the planet both environmentally and socially.



Earth Hour started in 2007 by the Worldwide Fund for Nature (WWF) as a lights-off event in Sydney, Australia. Now, 7000 countries across the globe participate. The campaign has been very successful in promoting awareness of the devastating effects on our planet that are a result of climate change.



Between 8.30 pm and 9.30 pm on Saturday 28th March, power was switched off across all lodges. Other activities were organized, such as recycling campaigns, riverbed and forest cleansing, presentations and videos, and a candle-lit parade with the local children of Machu Picchu in favor of these all-important 60 minutes.
