

## CHANNEL 5 AIRS NICK KNOWLES' RAILWAY ADVENTURE IN MACHU PICCHU

Beloved TV presenter, Nick Knowles, travelled from the American Southwest to the ancient Inca citadel of Machu Picchu for his new show airing on UK's Channel 5, Nick Knowles' Amazing Railway Adventure.

"My love of trains developed when I was a child and my father would take me to stand on a bridge in Southall, London, to watch old steam locomotives run by underneath," Knowles stated about this passion project.

For the season premiere in December 2022, Nick Knowles kicks off with a trip across the stunning sceneries of Peru; his trip concludes in Machu Picchu, the first carbon neutral wonder of the world. José Koechlin joined Nick on his visit to the lush gardens of Inkaterra Machu Picchu Pueblo Hotel, which, according to the American Orchid Society, is home to 214 bird species and the world's largest native orchid collection (372 species).

It immerses guests in Cusco's rich heritage and vibrant traditions. Additionally, Inkaterra Hacienda Urubamba, a contemporary hacienda-style hotel amid the green mountains and harvest fields of Cusco's Sacred Valley of the Incas, was noted as one of the best hotels in South America.

At the Ecoluxury Fair in Rome, Inkaterra received an award for their achievements in the 'Biosphere' category – a celebration of the brand's efforts to preserve one of our planet's most biodiverse areas.
