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

Explore the Rainforest Up Close



Trek through the trees on foot for a closer look at the natural wonders. Embark on a canopy walk and get a bird's-eye view of the Amazon jungle. The bravest expeditionists can even explore the jungle at night to see the nocturnal side of Tambopata.

Learn from the Ese-Eja

The Ese-Eja is this region's most populous indigenous group, who dwell in villages on the shores of the Tambopata River. They have expert skills in farming and fishing, as this community dates back to pre-Hispanic times! With such an intimate knowledge of the flora and fauna of this region, a day spent learning from the Ese-Eja natives is an invaluable experience.

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Near the jungle town of Puerto Maldonado lies this pristine oxbow lake, with tranquil waters that are ideal for boat tours and favored by some rare wildlife species who prefer an easy pace compared to the main river rapids. Embark on a Sandoval Lake boat tour and float out on a dreamy excursion learning about the ecology of the lake.

Collpa de Guacamayos



The Collpa de Guacamayos is one of the most fascinating sights in the Tambopata National Reserve. This clay lick attracts hundreds of colorful macaws and parrots, creating a breathtaking spectacle. Arriving early in the morning will give you the best chance to witness these birds as they gather to eat the mineral-rich clay, which aids in their digestion and provides needed minerals they are otherwise unable to get from their diets. This natural event is not only a visual feast but also an incredible insight into the behavior of Amazonian wildlife.

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Inkaterra Reserva Amazonica: Inspired by the cabanas built by local Ese-Eja people, the <u>Inkaterra Reserva</u> <u>Amazonica</u> is a magical, immersive escape. This ecolodge is one of the highest rated in the world according to National Geographic Traveler. With beautiful cabanas surrounded by the jungle, you will feel like you are camping in the most luxurious version of a rainforest treehouse.

Rainforest Posada Amazonas: The Posada Amazonas has also joined forces with the local community of Infierno to create a unique experience with luxurious, open-air rooms that allow the natural world in. Working with the local Infierno people, this lodge directly benefits the community that calls Tambopata their home, so your stay will not only feel like an authentic, upscale getaway, but you'll also be leaving a positive impact when you leave.

Rainforest Refugio Amazonas: Refugio Amazonas lies even deeper in the rainforest, a wilderness oasis perfect for nature lovers and families. This lodge offers plenty of family-friendly excursions and scientific exploration activities that make your stay an exciting educational adventure. As you escape under the stars and learn about the fascinating ecosystem of the jungle, you will also be treated to the luxury of a private cabana.

Inkaterra Hacienda Concepción: Another lovely lodge located in the heart of the Amazon is the Inkaterra Hacienda Concepción, a serene property within the Tambopata National Reserve along the shores of the Madre de Dios River. Guests can choose to stay in one of the luxurious, private cabanas or spend their time in the beautiful casa grande, with high ceilings and a rustic thatched roof.
